Workshop Engagement	Applicant struggles with staying on task and fails to complete the requested assignments or activities.	Though passionate about writing, the applicant has a difficult time engaging in specific prompts, possibly because they don't want to work on a genre of writing they're not familiar with.	Applicant is engaged for parts of the workshop, but has trouble staying on task for others.	Applicant is paying attention and engaged for all aspects of the workshop. They complete what is requested of them.	Applicant is enthusiastic and on task for the entire workshop, regardless of their experience level.	
Workshop Discussion	Applicant shows little interest in being a part of the discussion. They are unfocused and exhibit a lack of care for the readings and work of their colleagues.	Applicant is observant and shows interest in the workshop conversations, though they are hesitant to speak and may stop short of offering their own opinions.	Applicant gives some feedback and response during workshop discussions, though they may struggle to find the right wording and their responses may be off topic or tangential.	Applicant shows the willingness and ability to be a part of a meaningful discussion.	Student is engaged and actively voicing their opinion in the workshop discussions. Feedback and responses are meaningful and related to the discussion while being respectful to their colleagues.
